Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth and income by investing in a portfolio of investment grade securitised credit, while promoting ESG characteristics. The Fund qualifies under Article 8 of SFDR.



Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed and is not constrained by a benchmark. In normal market conditions, the Fund will invest at least 90% of its assets in securitised bonds that are rated at least BBB- by a credit rating agency; including asset backed securities, commercial mortgagebacked securities, collateralised loan obligations and residential mortgage-backed securities. The Fund may also invest in other bonds issued by companies, or issued or guaranteed by governments, government related entities and supranational bodies worldwide. The Fund includes the identification and analysis of a company's environmental and social factors and corporate governance practices as an integral part of the investment decision making process. Issuers considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies, which may change from time to time. The Fund may invest up to 10% in onshore Chinese bonds traded on the China Interbank Bond Market)and up to 10% in other funds. The Fund may temporarily invest in cash and money-market instruments issued by governments in developed markets. Main risks

- The Fund invests in bonds whose value generally falls when interest rates rise. This risk is typically greater the longer the maturity of a bond investment and the higher its credit quality. The issuers of certain bonds, could become unwilling or unable to make payments on their bonds and default. Bonds that are in default may become hard to sell or worthless.
- The Fund may invest in Emerging Markets, these markets are less established, and often more volatile, than developed markets and involve higher risks, particularly market, liquidity and currency risks.




